Historical Stone Harbor

BACK IN TIME - #2: Here is yet another early view of Stone Harbor taken from an airplane in 1920. Again I have included some labels as reference points so as to assist you with actual orientation as the subject here focuses on the northern portion of the town starting with 80th Street and the Avalon border on the right or to the north and extending southward to include 90th Street on the far left of this view.

Specifically, can you locate the Stone Harbor Yacht Club building in the upper left hand corner of this photo? Check out the Railroad Station that is still standing along Pennsylvania Avenue paralleling Second Avenue. The noted Harbor Inn (formerly the Abbotsford Inn) still exists as you can see but its days are certainly numbered. See the 3 basins skirting the Great Channel or the bay: North Basin, South Basin and Snug Harbor?

At this point I would like to draw your attention to one not so conspicuous feature. Along the beach and fronting the ocean, you should be able to recognize the boardwalk running from 83rd Street and progressing southward to 90th Street and a bit further on the lower left of this image. Apparently, when this photo was taken, a major storm had just recently occurred and it caused serious damage to portions of the boardwalk in this particular area. Look closely and you should be able to distinguish several breaks or interruptions where sections of the boardwalk were destroyed and would be in need of replacement.




Here is another aerial shot taken at the same time after the 1920 storm where we can see evidence of additional substantial destruction to sections of the boardwalk from 106th Street northward to at least 92nd Street and even beyond the view in this photo.

Photos such as these and others that have been presented in recent months in the "The SHPOA Beach Buzz" invariably contain some very interesting things and it is often advised to pay attention to the details for better understanding of some of the finer points of Stone Harbor history. That is why those who pursue the study of history often need to assume the role of a "detective" and get out the trusty magnifying glass for closer inspection. Enjoy the journey down memory lane.







