


President's Message - Chris Yates, President



Dr. Lenore Tedesco, Executive Director of the Wetlands Institute, gave a terrific presentation on the cutting edge research the Institute is conducting on marsh restoration and the project underway to restore Scotch Bonnet Island, which is part of the marsh behind the Institute's facility. This work, attracting researchers from across the globe, will help Stone Harbor and other coastal communities better protect the vital marshes that are key elements of resiliency in the face of sea level rise. Geoff Woolery, a SHPOA trustee, offered the second presentation about the REAL (Resilient Environments and Landscapes) rules proposed in Governor Murphy's Executive Order 100. This set of rules will have far-reaching and significant impacts on coastal communities and cost hundreds of millions of dollars to fully implement if adopted in





their present form. Geoff's presentation explains the primary elements of the rules that will impact Stone Harbor. At the meeting, we offered our gratitude to the retiring trustees: Jay Blackman, Beth Toolen, Paul Grady, and Rich Fuchs. All of them were dedicated trustees who did yeoman's work on behalf of the organization. We offered particular thanks to Rich, who served two terms as president, two terms as treasurer, and many years as a trustee. 
